A completed application must include in the following order:

part one:

- Application Cover Sheet (this page)

part two (no more than 9 pages):

- Abstract
- Personal Statement
- Project Description
- Timeline/Action Plan
- Budget
- Résumé

part three:

- Letter from Community Partner
- Letter(s) of Recommendation

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Application

Applications must be written in at least a 12 point font, with one inch margins and 1.5 spacing. A complete application includes:

Title and Abstract (100 words)

Describe (1) your interest in the fellowship program and (2) the project you wish to undertake.

Personal Statement (2 pages)

- We seek students who are passionate and reflective about their work. Tell us a story about yourself that illustrates these qualities.
- How has your approach to and thinking about community work changed over time?
- What do you hope to gain from the Starr community of fellows, and what will you contribute to it?

Project Statement (2-3 pages)

- Please discuss what skills and knowledge you currently possess that make you an appropriate candidate for this body of work.
- What challenges does this work present to you? (What experiences, skills, or knowledge do you lack?)
- Why does this work intrigue you?

Timeline (1 page)

Identify the major parts of your work and a clear start and end date for the project. (Note: the project may take place over a summer or during the academic year. At a minimum, projects must be 10 weeks in duration).

Budget (1 page)

Describe how you will use the funds you are requesting.

Resume (1 page)

Include an up-to-date resume of your past work, activities and interests.

Letters of Support

Applicants must submit at least one letter from a Brown faculty or staff advisor. Letters must be signed originals and must be submitted in a sealed envelope or mailed directly to the Fellowship Coordinator.

***If you go over the page limit, your application will not be considered.**
